

Historic Class of 2020 Celebrates a Unique MSDA Commencement

T t was a Friday the 13th unlike any

other. The senior class was gathered in the Doris M. Byrne Performing Arts Center (PAC) on that March morning, and informed that Disney World had announced its closure; the longawaited senior trip would not be taking place. The tears, hugs, sadness and uncertainty in the PAC that morning, preceded the announcement of what was to be a temporary transition to remote learning. As schools throughout the tri-state region and beyond made similar announcements, it was unclear at that time it was mere foreshadowing of what was to come: the virtual completion of the all coursework, the cancellation of in-person celebrations, and the physically disconnected nature of the final months of senior year. It wasn't the ride on Space Mountain or the fancy prom dress they'd truly miss, it was each other – sharing those last precious moments of high school, together.

Nineteen weeks later, resilience, patience, perseverance and an abundance of hope, led the graduates of the MSDA Class of 2020 to the softball field on the edge of campus for their in-person, socially distanced commencement. **Sister Fran Sullivan**, **OP** and Ana Serra-Prescott along with members of the staff, faculty and Parents' Association worked tirelessly to turn out the Mount's first-ever outdoor graduation ceremony, set amidst the backdrop of a global pandemic. The 125th commencement will not soon be forgotten, as the graduates processed from the Athletic Center, gracefully walking onto the field in their flowing white gowns, crisp caps, and custom bedazzled (and mandatory) face masks.

The Ceremony

Salutatorian Julie Schramm '20, who will be attending Lafayette College in the fall, welcomed the graduates and guests, and gave special recognition to the MSDA faculty. "I would like to recognize the teachers who have mentored us these past four years in the classroom, and then, in their dining rooms, kitchens, basements, back porches, and even cars," acknowledging the unique nature of virtual learning and the effort among teachers to carry on and complete the year.

Brenda Lally Herman '91, served as the 2020 commencement speaker. An Undergraduate Research Administrator in the Office of Research at the New Jersey Institute of Technology, and active supporter of Sandy Hook Promise, Brenda is focused in her service work on lifting up young people, and highlighted the seniors' strength, endurance, persistence, assertiveness, and adaptability displayed in the face of adversity. 

LISTENING, LEARNING AND TAKING ACTION: Diversity, Equity and Inclusion at MSDA

n the midst of a global "pause," when communities all over the world were sheltering in place and socially distancing with the goal of stemming the spread of the coronavirus, the horrific deaths of Breonna Taylor, Ahmaud Arbery and George Floyd spurred a pivotal moment and movement, in the pursuit of racial justice in the United States. In response to, and in support of MSDA's Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) community – both students and alumnae – who have shared their personal experiences with racism, micro-aggressions and implicit bias within the Mount, a call to action to create a culture of diversity, equity and inclusion within the Mount is underway.

With the mission of "seeking the truth in all aspects of life," the Mount is focused on a reexamination of race and equality, and making adjustments to create an environment consistent with the school's core Catholic and Dominican values – absent of racism, discrimination and bias of any kind, while fostering respect and representation for all. In a statement to the community, **Sister Fran Sullivan**, **OP '60** acknowledged the hurt experienced by present students and alumnae, apologized for mistakes that have been made, and affirmed the school's commitment to doing better, "It is not enough to apologize, we must commit to action and we are committed to doing just that, taking action!"

What is DEI?

It is important to understand what diversity, equity and inclusion mean in the context of social justice in order to foster a culture of inclusivity where marginalized groups are heard, valued and protected. The Ford Foundation uses the following definitions as guiding principles to help drive a fair and just culture:

- Diversity is the representation of varied identities and differences including but not limited to race, ethnicity, gender, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, national origin and socio-economic status.
- Equity seeks to ensure fair treatment, equality of opportunity, and fairness in access to information and resources for all.
- Inclusion builds a culture of belonging by actively inviting the contribution and participation of all people.



Change Helps Drive Progress

The important work to help elevate these tenets within the Mount community are immediately made stronger by enhancing equitable representation within the Mount's leadership team. Two MSDA alumnae who have collaborated to advocate for a more just school environment have been named to the MSDA Board of Trustees; Sandy S. Castor '01, who will lead the board's new DEI subcommittee, and Ghilianie Soto '08, who will lead the new DEI Alumnae Council. In the first of a series of conversations with MSDA leadership to help drive progress and further instill diversity, equity and inclusion into the school's culture and mission, a professionally moderated zoom conversation was hosted with Sister Fran and members of the alumnae community who bravely shared their personal experiences and advocated for change. In addition, an informational zoom forum for alumnae interested in learning more about the MSDA DEI Alumnae Council was moderated by Ghilianie, with the first leadership team meeting taking place on August 20.

To further galvanize the Mount's efforts in support of diversity, equity and inclusion and create a culture that will attract and welcome a more diverse student body and faculty, the administration will be conducting a climate assessment, working with a DEI consultant to help deliver a plan, with measurable and transparent milestones. Enhanced education and trainings will also take place for faculty, staff, and students in the near and long terms.

STAFF PROFILE: Laura Hollenbaugh, MSDA Dean of Academics

ORE THAN 12 YEARS OF TEACHING, COUNSELING AND LEADERSHIP EXPERIENCE at Don Bosco Prep in Ramsey, New Jersey, makes Laura Hollenbaugh uniquely qualified for her new role as Dean of Academics at Mount St. Dominic Academy. Though the make-up of the student body is distinctly different as Ms. Hollenbaugh makes the transition from an all-boys school to working with the young women of the Mount, there are many similarities, including a shared commitment to academic rigor and complementary missions of empowering young people with the understanding they will go on to make the world a better place.

As Assistant Principal for Academics at Don Bosco, a position she held since Fall 2017 before joining the Mount in early July, Ms. Hollenbaugh not only possesses the skills and expertise to successfully manage the day-to-day operations of the school with special focus on the academic progress of the students, but also the hands-on, practical experience of operating a school, educating students, and supporting teachers in a virtual environment. These are critical skills for educators and administrators in a world combatting a global pandemic through appropriate social distancing, enhanced hygiene practices and mask wearing.

A leader in developing the plans for the Mount's 2020-2021 school year, which currently constitutes a hybrid approach combining in-person and remote instruction aimed at de-densifying the school environment in an effort to keep students, faculty, staff and families as safe as possible, Ms. Hollenbaugh's on-boarding has not taken the traditional path, with most introductions, meetings and planning sessions taking place virtually.

"Despite the current barriers we face to making personal connections, I feel genuinely and warmly received, and I am grateful for this opportunity to be part of such an exceptional learning community," noted Ms. Hollenbaugh. "To now be in a single-gender school with young women is exhilarating for me, both personally and professionally, and I am eager to embrace the collective power of these young women, to support them in a process of authentic

self-discovery, and to help them capitalize on their strengths to become change agents in a world that really needs them."

Ms. Hollenbaugh began her career in education at Don Bosco in the classroom as a Social Studies teacher, a role she held from September 2008 to June 2015, and briefly returned to for the spring semester of 2019. From 2013 to 2018, she was a school counselor to the Don Bosco community of more than 850 young men. Ms. Hollenbaugh earned her Masters in Educational Leadership from St. Peter's University in 2019, her Masters in School Counseling from Seton Hall University in 2013, and her Bachelors in Psychology from Columbia University in 1993. She also maintains several academic and administrative certifications in the state of New Jersey including the Principal Certificate of Eligibility, Director of School Counseling Services, Supervisor, and School Counselor.



the group's discussion will play a part in breaking the stigma that surrounds mental health. Forty members of the Mount faculty and student body participated, all of which engaged in an informational discussion towards the conclusion of the talk.

Reflecting on her own personal experiences and her goals for hosting the discussion, Kate notes, "My mental health journey has been complicated, obscure, and strenuous. But all together, I would not change one bit of it because it made me the individual I am today. The purpose of this talk was to showcase how one "illness," "disease," or "disability" does not define you. Your kindness, compassion, and individuality, now that defines you. I have found who I am as an individual, the imperfectly perfect version of myself. I learned to love endlessly, and to live courageously, with this feeling of utmost gratitude that I showcased to the viewers. The positive feedback was ravishing, and everyone that participated in it was affected in a unique way. Creating this successful event taught me that dreams that seem so impossible are possible!"

Kate, who will be attending Susquehanna University in the fall, shared her profound gratitude to MSDA faculty member **Rob DeCarlo** for encouraging her to pursue the program. "He taught me how to dream, how to shoot for my goals knowing whatever happens is needed to happen in my journey. He helped me find myself, something that I am extremely thankful for."

"The novel (which is a summer reading text for English IV & English IVH) resulted in some incredible student-led conversations on complicated topics such as race, culture, class, immigration and, of course, mental health. Mira T. Lee gave us valuable insight into her personal experience with these topics as well as the process she went through to research them while crafting her narrative," noted Mr. Decarlo. "I am grateful to Kate for putting this together and proud of the progress she's made on her journey!"

Mutual Inspiration

In June 2018, **Catherine Brown '21**, created an Instagram account called *allways.kindness* with the goal of spreading kindness and showing the power that kindness can have in making the world a better place. Through her page, Catherine created a GoFundMe page with the goal of raising money to purchase Chromebooks for students who didn't have access to computers. With the arrival of the COVID-19 crisis in March 2020, and the resulting transition to remote learning causing the digital divide in communities throughout the country to grow wider, there was no better time for Catherine to mobilize her plan. With more than \$2,500 raised, Catherine was able to purchase 19 new Chromebooks along with 700 facemasks.

Having been inspired by Principal Akbar Cook from West Side High School in Newark after a feature highlighting his work on the Ellen Show, Catherine contacted him to see if his students could use the Chromebooks, and in May 2020, she made the special delivery. So moved by Catherine and her family's kindness and desire to be of service, Principal Cook took to Instagram live to share her story with his 22,000 followers. During the chat, he explained the hardships faced by some of his students due to the digital divide, and how Catherine's efforts will help remove that barrier for them.

"As tragic as the COVID-19 pandemic has been, I believe God timed my donation perfectly," Catherine noted. "Principal Cook was so overwhelmed and so genuinely grateful to accept the donation for his students. His heartfelt and sincere reaction elevated my passion to spread kindness in all ways."

Mount Alumnae of Service to Others Across Healthcare and Essential Services

N THE EARLY DAYS OF MARCH 2020, WHEN THE IMPACTS OF THE CORONAVIRUS WERE FIRST BEING FELT across the New Jersey/Tri-state area and residents began to shelter in place in their homes, alumnae of Mount St. Dominic Academy were suiting up in their hard to come by PPE (personal protective equipment) and heading to the front lines. Healthcare professionals, first responders, essential service providers and more, Mount alumnae called to serve, bravely left the security of their homes and the comfort of their families to care for their communities.

From providing safe access to food and groceries to delivering acute care to the most critically ill COVID patients, Mount alumnae - those shown here and the countless others on the front lines serving in similar ways - continue to mobilize. The candid and moving first-hand accounts of these MSDA SuperSHEros tell stories of improvised ICUs and reassignments to dedicated COVID-positive patient units; concern for their personal safety, but more so that of their family members; and uncertainty, fear and anxiety. But they also share common themes of professionalism, camaraderie and teamwork; of hope, compassion and gratitude - the silver linings that strengthened their courage to carry on in their service to others. The insights provided by their honest accounts of being immersed in the crisis provide those who read them with a rare perspective of the enormity of the global emergency and how it is directly hitting so close to home.

Just a Glimpse - In Their Own Words

Erika (Samsky) Sant'Ambrogio '10 - Emergency Medicine Physician Assistant, Saint **Barnabas Medical Center**

"It is emotionally exhausting but this is what I signed up to do, help people. Some are ok and just go home like they have the flu. Others are talking to me one minute and unfortunately pass without warning the next. Some come in with severe respiratory distress or chest pain and we rush to figure out the cause. Covid19 is not only novel but it seems to be reckless, causing anything from strokes to kidney failure, and of course respiratory distress."

Maddy Renzetti '10 - Resident Physician, NYP/Weill-Cornell Medical Center "One thing that has been incredible is the camaraderie throughout all of the departments. We are all unsure and scared, but we are all in this together."

Shannon Heil '12 - Speech Language Pathologist, Family of Caring at Ridgewood "To all other healthcare and essential workers, thank you SO much for everything you do! Your work and passion is not overlooked. I am so lucky to work alongside such dedicated doctors, nurses, therapists, and maintenance workers at my facility. Thank YOU!"



"I am blessed and honored to work with our more than 13,000 employees who provide care for our patients especially during these unprecedented times," Monica said, remarking on the dedication of the staff members of MLH who work tirelessly on the frontlines during this global pandemic, caring for their patients and community members at their most vulnerable time. "Our healthcare system is deeply rooted in the community and there is a high level of poverty, but our work transforms lives."

As part of the organization's 10-person System Leadership Team, Monica oversees human resources, information technology, corporate risk, compliance and legal services for the Memphis-based, nonprofit healthcare system, which encompasses more than 100 sites of care — from primary care practices to highly specialized teaching hospitals.

"I love my work," Monica continued, emphasizing that her work is her passion. Helping the organization achieve its mission relative to providing individuals with healthcare regardless of their ability to pay, she closely identifies with the core values at the heart of MLH -- service, quality, integrity, teamwork and innovation.

What is Success?

Grateful for the strong guidance she had as a young woman – from God, her parents and her mother in particular who sometimes worked three jobs to ensure her education at the Mount, from her close Mount friends, and from the "tough but extremely encouraging" **Sister Barbara Cowan**, **OP** – Monica knew early on that law was her calling. While she couldn't have predicted at that time that her



career path would lead to healthcare, she did know what type of success she aspired to, and it was a question – what does success look like - posed at an MSDA peer leadership retreat, that helped her form that vision for herself.

"Success is not just monetary, it is tied to community, to family, and to wholeness as an individual," said Monica. "It's about where you give and where you serve."

Getting There

In addition to her goal of pursuing a career in law, Monica also desired the unique university and cultural experiences distinctively offered by a Historically Black College (HBCU) after graduating from the Mount. As an undergraduate at Hampton University in Hampton, Va., she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in English to enhance her written and oral communications skills, and a successful LSAT score helped pave the way for her pursuit of a law degree at The College of William & Mary in Williamsburg, Va.

Monica practiced law in Virginia, including a judicial law clerkship for the United States District Court for the Western District of Virginia, as well as in North Carolina before moving to Memphis, Tenn. where her husband, Andre' (whom she met at Hampton and is also a lawyer) grew up. Her work at a Memphis law firm exposed her to the world of healthcare, a sector she was told by a colleague "will never be dull and will always be interesting." Then, began Monica's professional intersection of law and healthcare, as she was recruited as Senior Vice President/Chief Legal Officer and General Counsel at Regional One Health in 2008.

When Purpose Meets Passion

Named a "Super Woman in Business" by the *Memphis Business Journal*, Monica balances her career with being a mother to three sons – Andrew, 14, Arthur, 10 and Abram, 7. As wife, mom, and business leader, she leads by example. Active in her community, Monica serves as board chair for the American Heart Association, and on the boards of the Women's Foundation of Greater Memphis, the University of Memphis Foundation, the Community Foundation of Memphis and Facing History and Ourselves. She is a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and the Links, Inc. Monica

and her husband are active members of St. Andrew A.M.E. Church.

"Foundationally, I want to be of service and help others, and a career in healthcare allows me to accomplish this," Monica concluded. Along her path from the Mount, to Hampton, to the practice of law and now to her home in Memphis supporting the healthcare needs of her community, she has never felt like there was something she couldn't accomplish. "I've worked to align my purpose with my passion. There are lots of long hours, but when tied to a strong mission of service, it makes it worthwhile."


